Since the inception of IGC's Bangladesh country programme in 2009, it has been involved in policy research to help achieve sustainable economic growth and development. The second part of the lecture will be centred on the liberalisation episodes in South Asia and the case of how unleashing market forces can further expand economic opportunities in Bangladesh.
