





Increase Tourism receipts in a sustainable manner




Increase participation of the private sector in driving the tourism growth

Conserve the biodiversity inside the protected areas for the benefits of future generations



Difficulty of accessing land for tourism investments


Little focus on the environment and sustainability




TOURISM PRODUCT DEVT



The Government has invested significantly in the national carrier RwandAir which is greatly expanding



International and local airports. Road network countrywide has been enhanced and support tourism activities


