Invest in Local Economic Development and Public Private Partnerships to enhance growth of industries and value addition: e.g. Fort Portal City to take advantage of Agri-LED based industrial parks that are being established under the Ruwenzori subregion.

 Start and develop Incubators for the small scale operators. These Cities should be assisted to start Incubators for the small scale operators and support them to build skills, precision, joint ventures, market and mass production. This is where Business Incubation & Small scale Enterprises (SME) Workspaces Business Incubators helps both start-ups and existing small businesses to grow sustainably, hence lowering the mortality rate of SMEs through the use of good businesses practices and appropriate technology.

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Develop the related bankable projects and source for partnership Cities should develop the related bankable projects and source for partnership and financing from different sources. This will boost production and employment within the rural areas and further widen the tax base.

Implement key strategies in the Domestic Revenue Mobilization Strategy (DRMS) and the LG Revenue Mobilisation Strategy to enhance City's fiscal capacity

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Explore into Alternative LG Financing

Cities should utilise opportunities available for Alternative LG Financing (this includes soliciting for loanable funds for development projects). Also includes creation of a fund blending grants from central government, borrowings from multilateral / bilateral agencies and bonds subscribed by national and local level development agencies.

Cities should participate and access **Cities Alliance (**to source for ideas and funding to reduce bottlenecks in developing urban settlements and enhance economic growth**).**
