Purpose of the fund:

The **State Fragility Initiative (SFi)** is offering **scoping grants of up to £5,000** to PhD students and early-career researchers. These grants aim to support **preliminary research, field visits, and early-stage project development** related to **fragile institutions or conflict**.

There are **no restrictions** on specific research topics, as long as the project aligns with these broad themes. The funding can be used to **assess feasibility, refine research approaches, and establish partnerships** with key stakeholders. This may include costs related to **travel, consultations, focus groups, preliminary data collection, or small pilot studies**.

Research areas may include (but are not limited to):

- Origins of state fragility or conflict
- Peacebuilding or post conflict recovery
- Policy responses to state fragility or conflict

Who can apply?

We welcome applications from **PhD students and early-career researchers** working on topics related to **state fragility and conflict**. Researchers from **social science disciplines beyond economics** are also encouraged to apply.

Deadline:

Applications are **reviewed on a rolling basis** and should be submitted **no later than Sunday 23:59 GMT, 15 February**. Early submission is encouraged.

How to apply?

- 1. Fill out the attached form that summarises your research project and how you would like to spend the grant.
- 2. Email the completed form to: sfi@theigc.org as early as possible and 15 February 2025 at the latest.
- 3. Applications will be competitively reviewed by the SFi team.
- 4. Successful applicants will then be invited to a call with a policy economist from SFi to discuss the project and next steps.
